A NOTE FROM YOUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

Let's step out together joyfully and with purpose into the New Year!

I've enjoyed singing all our Christmas carols and, as you know from the services I take, I like singing them till the end of January: the feast of Candlemas on February 2 brings the Church's season of Christmas and Epiphany to a close. But I do like the more unusual carols, and in particular the ones which point us towards Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

I wonder, do you know this carol? Here's the first verse:

Born in the night, Mary's child, a long way from Your home;
Coming in need, Mary's child, born in a borrowed room.

This helps to remind me that God in Jesus is identified with the poor and homeless in our society. The second verse, too, is very apt for our present-day society

Clear shining light, Mary's child, your face lights up our way:
Light of the world, Mary's child, dawn on our darkened day.

"Our darkened day" - whichever year we are beginning, there seems to be so much to pray about: whether it is those who sleep rough on our streets, or those who are denied the basics necessary for life. We all bear the people of Yemen - and of so many other places - in our hearts.

The carol carries on to point us towards our hope in this darkened world of ours:

Truth of our life, Mary's child, you tell us God is good:
Prove it is true, Mary's child, go to Your cross of wood.

You see how this carol shifts our attention from the baby in the manger to the man on the cross? Our faith is that it is through the events of Lent, Holy Week and Easter that we are able to join together in the work of bringing in God's kingdom of love, mercy, justice and peace. And my, how our world needs this.

The final verse urges us to put our faith, hope and trust in Mary's child, our Lord Jesus Christ:

Hope of the world, Mary's child, you're coming soon to reign:
King of the earth, Mary's child, walk in our streets again.

Let us pledge ourselves this new year of 2018 to look for Jesus in the face of everyone we meet every day of this year.

The Parish Council has decided to look at the feasibility of producing a Neighbourhood Plan for Middleton-on-the-Wolds.

The plan can include a vision, aims, planning policies, proposals for improving the area or providing new facilities, or allocation of key sites for specific kinds of development.

Although the Parish Council will take the lead in producing such a plan it is crucial that members of the Middleton-on-the-Wolds community are fully involved in the process.

We will be publishing a link to an online survey early in the New Year requesting views and comments from local residents and businesses on a variety of topics. The link to this survey will be made available on the existing village website and printed copies will be made available for those without access to the internet.
